

ACADEMIC UNITS AND FUNCTIONS, AFFILIATED INSTITUTIONS, AND RELATED ACTIVITIES OF THE UNIVERSITY

Standing Order 110.1 Academic Units and Functions, Affiliated Institutions, and Related Activities of the University.

The Board has established the colleges, schools, graduate divisions, certain other major academic units, affiliated institutions, and related activities at the several campuses and facilities of the University of California, and, upon the recommendation of the President of the University, with the advice of the Academic Senate, has established the degrees awarded by the several academic units of the University. Detailed provisions of this establishment shall be set forth in the minutes of the Board. The Board may amend these provisions by resolution, upon recommendation of the President of the University. The President is authorized to approve name changes of academic units and establishment, name changes, and discontinuance of degree titles, upon approval by the Academic Senate.

1. Academic Colleges at Berkeley¹

(a) There are established at Berkeley three (3) academic colleges in each of which there is an undergraduate curriculum as follows:

- College of Chemistry leading to the degree of Bachelor of Science.
- College of Engineering leading to the degree of Bachelor of Science and with graduate curriculum leading to the degree of Master of Translational Medicine jointly offered by the Schools of Pharmacy and Medicine at San Francisco.²
- College of Letters and Science leading to the degree of Bachelor of Arts.

2. Professional College at Berkeley³

(a) There is established at Berkeley one (1) professional college as follows:

College of Environmental Design with undergraduate curricula leading to the degrees of Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Architecture, and Bachelor of Landscape Architecture, and graduate curricula leading to the degrees of Master of Architecture, Master of City Planning, Master of Landscape Architecture, and Master of Urban Design.

3. Academic and Professional College at Berkeley⁴

(d) There is established at Berkeley one (1) academic and professional college as

follows:

College of Natural Resources with undergraduate academic and professional curricula leading to the degree of Bachelor of Science and professional graduate curricula leading to the degrees of Master of Forestry and Master of Development Practice.

4. **Council for Special Curricula at Berkeley¹**, DISESTABLISHMENT approved by Berkeley Senate Division 4-25-2005.
5. **Council for Ethnic Studies Curricula at Berkeley²**, DISESTABLISHMENT approved by Berkeley Senate Division 4-25-2005.
6. **Academic Colleges at Davis³**

(a) There are established at Davis four (4) academic colleges in each of which there is an undergraduate curriculum as follows:

- College of Letters and Science, leading to the degrees of Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Science, and Bachelor of Arts and Science.
- College of Engineering, leading to the degree of Bachelor of Science.
- College of Agricultural and Environmental Sciences, leading to the degree of Bachelor of Science.
- College of Biological Sciences, leading to the degrees of Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Science, and graduate curricula leading to the degrees of Master of Arts, Master of Science, and Doctor of Philosophy.⁴

7. **Academic Colleges at Los Angeles**

(a) There is established at Los Angeles one academic college in which there is an undergraduate curriculum as follows:

College of Letters and Science, leading to the degrees of Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Science⁵, and Bachelor of Arts and Science⁶.

8. Academic Colleges at Riverside¹

(a) There are established at Riverside three (3) academic and graduate colleges in each of which there are undergraduate curricula as follows:

- College of Natural and Agricultural Sciences, leading to degrees of Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science.²
- College of Humanities, Arts, and Social Sciences, leading to the degrees of Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science.³
- College of Engineering, leading to the degree of Bachelor of Science.⁴

9. Academic Colleges at Santa Barbara⁵

(a) There are established at Santa Barbara three (3) academic colleges in each of which there is an undergraduate curriculum as follows:⁶

- College of Creative Studies, leading to the degrees of Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Sciences.⁷
- College of Engineering, leading to the degree of Bachelor of Science⁸ and Master of Technology Management.⁹
- College of Letters and Science, leading to the degrees of Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Science, Bachelor of Music, and Bachelor of Fine Arts.¹⁰

10. Academic Colleges at San Diego¹¹

- (a) There is established at San Diego Revelle College with undergraduate curricula leading to the degrees of Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science.¹²
- (b) There is established at San Diego the John Muir College with undergraduate curricula leading to the degrees of Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science.¹³
- (c) There is established at San Diego the Third College with undergraduate curricula leading to the degrees of Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science.¹⁴
- (d) There is established at San Diego the Fourth College with undergraduate curricula leading to the degrees of Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science.¹⁵

- (e) There is established at San Diego the Fifth College with undergraduate curricula leading to the degrees of Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science.¹
- (f) There is established at San Diego the Sixth College with undergraduate curricula leading to the degrees of Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science.²

11. Academic Schools and Colleges at Irvine³

- (a) There are established at Irvine eight (8) academic schools and one (1) college, with curricula based on two or more years of undergraduate work as follows:⁴
 - School of Biological Sciences, leading to the degrees of Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science.
 - School of the Arts, leading to the degrees of Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Fine Arts, and Bachelor of Music.⁵
 - School of Humanities, leading to the degree of Bachelor of Arts.
 - School of Information and Computer Science, leading to the degrees of Bachelor of Science, Master of Science, and Doctor of Philosophy.⁶
 - School of Medicine, leading to the degrees of Bachelor of Science, Master of Science, and Doctor of Medicine.⁷
 - School of Physical Sciences, leading to the degrees of Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science.
 - School of Social Ecology, leading to the degree of Bachelor of Arts.⁸
 - School of Social Sciences, leading to the degrees of Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science.
 - College of Health Sciences, leading to the degrees of Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Science, Master of Arts, Master of Science, Doctor of Medicine, and Doctor of Philosophy.⁹

12. Council for Interschool Curricula at Irvine¹⁰

- (a) There is established at Irvine, under the jurisdiction of the Academic Senate, a Council for Interschool Curricula (not under the jurisdiction of a School) leading to the degrees of Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science.

13. Academic Colleges at Santa Cruz

- (a) There is established at Santa Cruz Cowell College with undergraduate curricula leading to the degrees of Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science.
- (b) There is established at Santa Cruz Adlai E. Stevenson College with undergraduate curricula leading to the degrees of Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science.¹
- (c) There is established at Santa Cruz Crown College with undergraduate curricula leading to the degrees of Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science.²
- (d) There is established at Santa Cruz Merrill College with undergraduate curricula leading to the degrees of Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science.³
- (e) There is established at Santa Cruz College Five with undergraduate curricula leading to the degrees of Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science.⁴
- (f) There is established at Santa Cruz Kresge College with undergraduate curricula leading to the degrees of Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science.⁵
- (g) There is established at Santa Cruz College VII with undergraduate curricula leading to the degrees of Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science.⁶
- (h) There is established at Santa Cruz College VIII with undergraduate curricula leading to the degrees of Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science.⁷
- (i) There is established at Santa Cruz College IX with undergraduate curricula leading to the degrees of Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science.⁸
- (j) There is established at Santa Cruz College X with undergraduate curricula leading to the degrees of Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science.⁹

14. Academic Schools and Colleges at Merced¹⁰

- (a) There are established at Merced three (3) academic schools with one (1) undergraduate college, in each of which there is an undergraduate curriculum as follows:
 - School of Engineering, leading to the degree of Bachelor of Science.
 - School of Natural Sciences, leading to the degrees of Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science.
 - School of Social Sciences, Humanities, and Arts, leading to the degrees of Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science.
 - College One, leading to the degrees of Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science.

15. Professional Schools

- (a) There are established the following schools, with curricula based on two or more years of undergraduate work:¹

Administration/ Business/Management

- Walter A. Haas School of Business, at Berkeley, with a curriculum leading to the degree of Bachelor of Science, and a curricula leading to the degree of Master of Business Administration,² Master of Financial Engineering, Master of Professional Accountancy, and Doctor of Philosophy.
- Graduate School of Management at Davis, with curricula leading to the degrees of Master of Business Administration, Master of Professional Accountancy,³ and Doctor of Philosophy.⁴

- School of Business Administration, at Riverside, with curricula leading to the degrees of Bachelor of Science, Master of Arts, Master of Business Administration, Master of Professional Accountancy,¹⁰ and Doctor of Philosophy.¹¹
- Management School, at San Diego, with curricula leading to the degrees of Master of Business Administration, Master of Finance,¹² and Doctor of Philosophy.
- Graduate School of Administration, at Santa Barbara, with curricula leading to the degrees of Master of Business Administration and Doctor of Philosophy.¹³

Architecture

- Graduate School of Architecture and Urban Planning, at Los Angeles, DISESTABLISHMENT approved by The Regents 7-15-94. [Restructuring; see School of Arts and Architecture.]
- School of the Arts and Architecture, at Los Angeles, with curricula leading to the degrees of Bachelor of Arts, Master of Architecture, Master of Arts, Master of Fine Arts, and Doctor of Philosophy.¹⁴

- School of Engineering and Applied Science, at Los Angeles, with a four-year undergraduate curriculum leading to the degree of Bachelor of Science, and curricula leading to the degrees of Master of Science and Doctor of Philosophy.⁸
- School of Engineering, at San Diego, with curricula leading to the degree of Bachelor of Science, and graduate curricula leading to the degrees of Master of Science, and Doctor of Philosophy.⁹

- School of Nursing, at Irvine, with a curriculum leading to the degree of Bachelor of Science, a curriculum leading to the degree of Master of Science, and a curriculum leading to the degree of Doctor of Philosophy.²

Optometry

(c) The Graduate Divisions shall embrace all graduate activities of the academic and professional departments on their respective campuses.

17. Such other degrees may be awarded as from time to time may be approved by the Board by appropriate amendment to the Standing Orders upon the recommendation of the President, acting with the advice of the Academic Senate.

18. Affiliated Colleges

(a) There are in San Francisco the following institutions affiliated with the University:³

San Francisco Art Institute; Hastings College of the Law, with a curriculum leading to the degree of Juris Doctor and Master of Laws (in Taxation).

(i) Subject to the approval of The Regents of the University of California, the officers and employees of Hastings College of the Law are appointed, promoted, demoted, and dismissed, and its curriculum determined by the Board of Trustees of the College in accordance with the provisions of the original endowment thereof, acts of the Legislature adopted pursuant thereto, and the agreement by which the College was affiliated with the University of California.

(ii) The San Francisco Art Institute is governed by its own Board of Trustees in all matters.

(iii) No officer or employee in the San Francisco Art Institute or the Hastings College of the Law shall receive any salary or other compensation as such from the funds of the University under the control of the Board, and no liability shall be incurred on behalf of The Regents of the University of California by any officer or employee in the San Francisco Art Institute or the Hastings College of the Law.

(b) There is at Irvine the following Institution affiliated with the University:

California College of Medicine. The operations of California College of Medicine shall be governed in accordance with the provisions of the agreement by which the College was affiliated with the University of California, as that agreement is amended from time to time.

19. University Extension

There is established a University Extension.

20. University of California Press

There is established a University of California Press which shall be administered pursuant to regulations prescribed by the President. The scope of the activities of the University of California Press shall be prescribed by the President with the approval of the Board.

21. Division of Agricultural Sciences¹

There is established a Division of Agricultural Sciences which shall consist of the College of Natural Resources at Berkeley, the College of Agricultural and Environmental Sciences and the School of Veterinary Medicine at Davis, the College of Biological and Agricultural Sciences at Riverside, Agricultural Experiment Station, including the Citrus Research Center (established in accordance with the provisions of the Hatch Act adopted by Congress and approved March 2, 1887 and related actions), and the Cooperative Extension (established in accordance with provisions of the Smith Lever Act adopted by Congress and approved May 8, 1914), the Giannini Foundation of Agricultural Economics, and the Kearney Foundation of Soil Science.
