PROVOST BROWN

Dear Michael:

I am writing in regard to questions, comments, and concerns that have arisen from within the University, the Native American community, and policymakers about the University's policy and processes related to the curation, repatriation, and disposition of Native American remains and cultural items in the University's custody. The "Policy and Procedures on Curation and Repatriation of Human Remains and Cultural Items" was first adopted in 1991 and last substantively revised in 2001. It addresses the treatment and disposition of Native American and Native Hawaiian remains and cultural items in the University's custody. The policy also addresses the repatriation of such remains and cultural items (e.g., funerary objects, sacred objects, and objects of cultural patrimony) under applicable law, including the federal Native American Graves Protection and Repatriation Act.

Concerns include:

- variances among campus implementation approaches,
- the timeliness of the repatriation process,
- whether policies reflect the most recent regulatory developments, and
- whether there is appropriate consideration of tribal viewpoints.


In light of these concerns, I am asking you to assemble a small committee, in consultation with appropriate members of Native American tribes, the existing University Advisory Group on Cultural Affiliation and Repatriation of Human Remains and Cultural Items, and the Academic Senate, to conduct a substantive review and revision of the University's NAGPRA policies, committee structures, and implementation practices in order to strengthen our policies and practices. The committee should define the circumstances under which the research and teaching use of remains and cultural items in the University's possession is appropriate and the circumstances under which the University will offer repatriation of remains and cultural items beyond that which is required by law.
