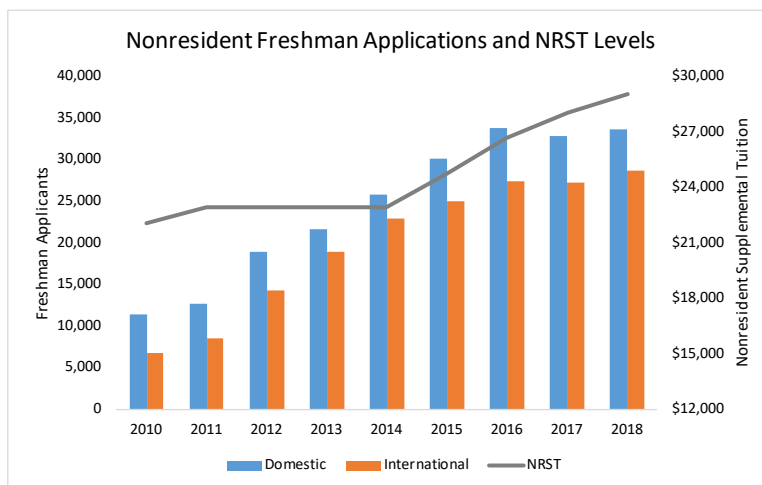


### Nonresident Undergraduate Enrollment Statistics

**Display A:**

**Nonresident Freshman Applications and Nonresident Supplemental Tuition (NRST) Levels**

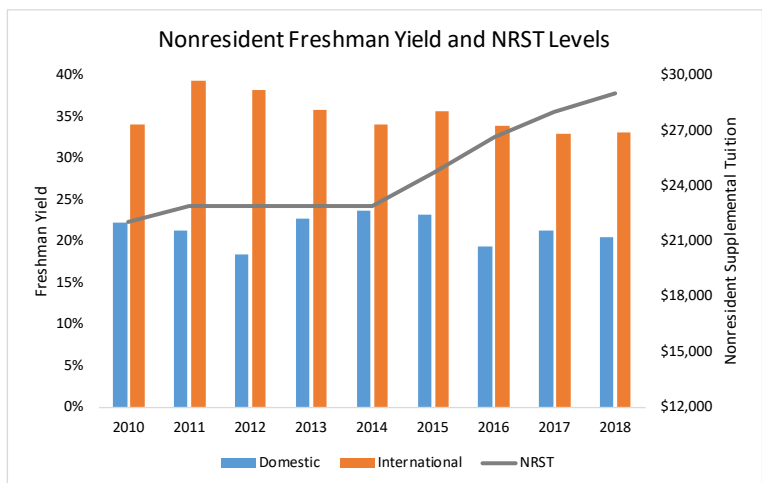
- Freshman applications for admissions from domestic nonresident students and international students remain strong despite increases in NRST (shown by the gray line) each year since 2015-16.



**Display B:**

**Nonresident Freshman Yield and Nonresident Supplemental Tuition (NRST) Levels**

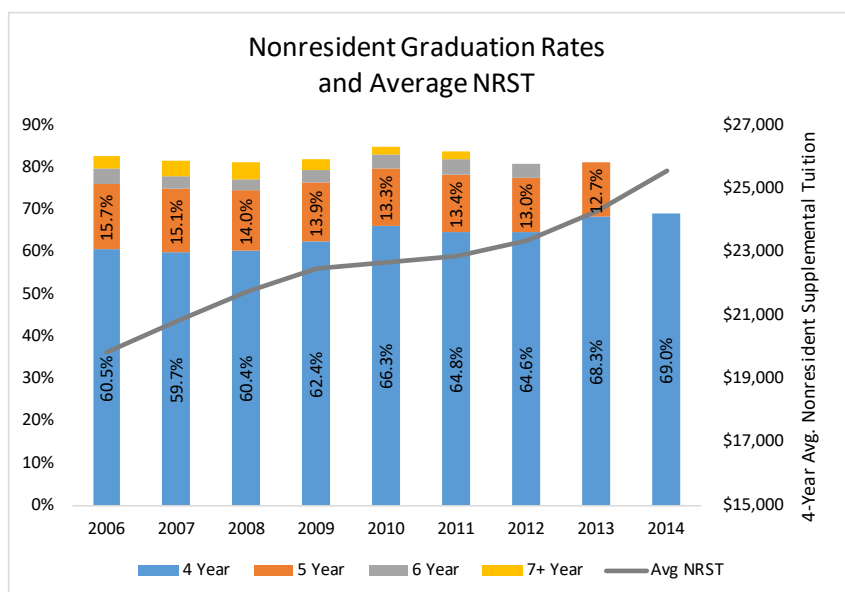
- The percentage of nonresident undergraduate students who decide to accept their UC offer of admission (“yield”) has changed little over time despite previous increases in NRST.



**Display C:**

**Nonresident Undergraduate Graduation Rates and Four-Year Average Nonresident Supplemental Tuition (NRST) Rates**

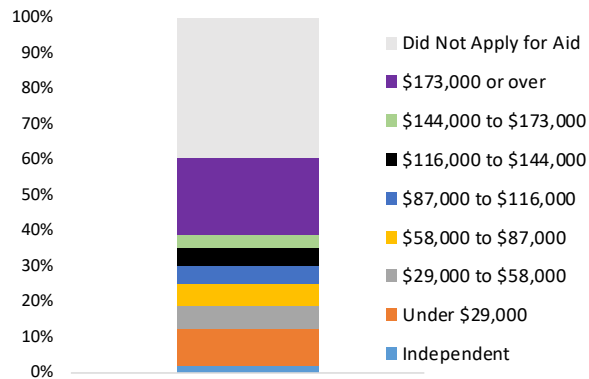
- Four- and five-year graduation rates for nonresident UC undergraduates have gradually improved over time even as NRST has increased.



**Display D:**

**Domestic Nonresident Financial Aid Applicants by Parent Income, 2017-18**

- Income categories are based on income reported on the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), which UC considers to be the most reliable source of parent income data because it is subject to verification under federal law.
- For some students, the parent income reported on the FAFSA is not necessarily an accurate indicator of the family’s financial resources. For example, is it not uncommon for a parent to write off business or farm losses on their tax returns, resulting in little or zero net income on the FAFSA.
- Students who did not apply for financial aid likely have the financial wherewithal to cover a proposed 2.6% increase to NRST.

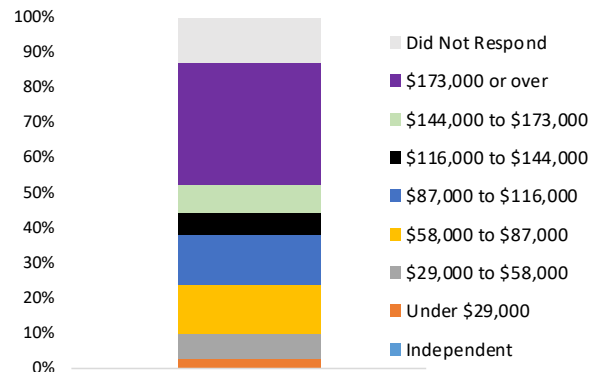

**Display E:**

**International Nonresident Undergraduates by Parent Income, 2017-18**

- Because international students generally do not file a FAFSA, the undergraduate application for admission is the primary source of information about these students’ parent incomes.
- The display shows the number and percentage of international nonresident students in different income categories based on self-reported parental incomes from the admissions application.
- International students are required to demonstrate that they have the resources to finance their UC education as a condition of receiving a student visa.
